RAILROAD INDUSTRY PERIODICALS

Canadian Guide. Published annually by Interguide Publications, Inc. Single copy C\$28.00. Postage and Ontario P.S. Tax extra. A complete shippers guide and gazetter for Canada. Certain Canadian railway timetables are included.

Intermodal Reporter. Published bi-weekly by the International Thomson Transport Press. Yearly \$210.00. Covering essential news of intermodalism: rail policy issues, equipment situations, damage and loss liability, wholesale vs. retail intermodalism, labor, antitrust, and the battle for market share and its effect on the shipper.

International Railway Journal and Rapid Transit Review. Published monthly by Simmons-Boardman Publishing Corporation. Yearly \$33.00. Reports the latest railway developments and practices all over the world. Articles are in English, with resumes in French, German and Spanish.

Modern Railroads. Published bi-weekly by International Thomson Transport Press. Single copies: \$5.00 in U.S., \$6.00 in Canada. Yearly: \$40 in U.S., \$45 in Canada. Features industry technical and operational developments, alternative solutions to problems affecting railroad profitability, plus implications of legislation and rail industry public-policy positions. Also contains opinion articles and reports on management changes. Second edition each month highlights short line and regional railroads.

The Official Intermodal Equipment Register. Published quarterly by International Thomson Transport Press. Single copy \$35.00; yearly \$40.00. Contains dimensions, capacities and other pertinent data for containers, trailers and chassis in intermodal use on U.S. railroads. Lists ramp locations and port facilities, and names of officials concerned with reports and payments.

The Official Railway Equipment Register. Published quarterly by International Thomson Transport Press. Single copy \$32.00; yearly \$83.00. Contains dimensions, capacities, reporting marks, and series of freight cars operated by railroads and private car companies of North America. Includes interchange points for railroads and home points for private car owners, with instructions regarding payments, movements and repairs.

The Official Railway Guide, Freight Service Edition. Published bi-monthly by International Thomson Transport Press. Single copy \$32.00; yearly \$80.00. Contains names and addresses of railroads providing freight service in North America and Mexico. Includes rail freight schedules, mileage, connections and other facilities of North American and Mexican railroads, as well as system maps and names of officials.

The Official Railway Guide, North American Travel Edition. Published bi-monthly by International Thomson Transport Press. Single copy \$32.00; yearly \$54.00. Complete Amtrak and VIA Rail timetables for U.S. and Canada, with fares, equipment, ticket offices and station index cross references. Also connecting bus, ferry, and commuter tables.

The Pocket List of Railroad Officials. Published quarterly by International Thomson Transport Press. Single copy \$32.00; yearly \$46.00. Contains names, titles and location of officials of railroads, private car companies, transit systems, railroad and government associations, boards and commissions. Shows mileage and equipment operated for railroads in the U.S., Canada, Mexico and other select international regions. Lists products, sales offices and representatives of more than 500 supply company advertisers.

Progressive Railroading. Published monthly by Murphy-Richter Publishing Company. Single copy \$4.00; yearly \$30.00. An illustrated journal of new railway equipment, procedures and supplies circulating primarily among railway officials in mechanical, engineering, purchasing and stores, electrical, signaling and communications departments.

Rail Classics. Published bi-monthly by Challenge Publications, Inc. Yearly \$14.50. Divides coverage between the history of railroads and present-day operations.

Railfan & Railroad Magazine. Published monthly by Carstens Publications, Inc. Single copy \$2.50; yearly \$23.00. A magazine for railroad buffs and employees with features on railroad equipment and operations, both contemporary and historical, plus rail history activities and equipment restorations. Regular columns include reviews of rail-oriented books and videotapes, rail photography, and developments in rapid transit.

Railway Age. Published monthly by Simmons-Boardman Publishing Corporation. Single copy \$3.00 plus postage; yearly \$35.00. Discusses current railway issues, progress and developments, and carries general news and statistics of the industry. Circulates extensively among railway officials and others interested in railway affairs.

Railway Line Clearances. Published annually, with interim change circulars, by International Thomson Transport Press. Yearly \$32.00. Presents weight limitations, and vertical and horizontal clearances for more than 250 railroads in North America.

Railway Track and Structures. Published monthly by Simmons-Boardman Publishing Corporation. Circulates among those employees who build and maintain tracks, bridges and other segments of the railway plant.
